## ELECTION CODE of the INUVIK NATIVE BAND



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#### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this written election code customized for the Inuvik Native Band is as follows:

- 1. Ensure that the majority, of the electors understand and agree with the election procedures outlined in their code;
- 2. Minimize problems commonly encountered in electing Chiefs and Councilors;
- 3. Avoid possible challenges to a First Nation's election based on Section 15 of the *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms*;
- 4. Allow for an appeal procedure whereby allegations of violations of the provisions of the election code may be decided upon;
- 5. Provide a mechanism whereby elected officials may be removed from office prior to the end of their term;
- 6. Include a procedure for amending the code as required to meet the Inuvik Native Band's changing circumstances; and
- 7. Meet the minimum standards for a leadership selection code set out in Sub-section 5(1) of the Government's proposed *First Nations Governance Act* (BillC-7).

#### **SOURCE DOCUMENTS**

To assist in the preparation of this Inuvik Native Band election code, the following source documents have been used:

- 1. Bill C -7, House of Commons of Canada, First Nations Governance Act.
- 2. C.R.C., c. 952, Indian Band Election Regulations (pursuant to Indian Act).
- 3. Office of the Chief Municipal Elections Officer, MACA, GNWT, Guide to Local Authorities Elections, Returning Officer's Manual (pursuant to Local Authorities Elections Act) revised August, 2000.

This document shall beknown as the *Inuvik Native Band* Election Code.

#### 1. Definitions

"Candidate" means a person seeking election as a Council member/Chief.

"Code" means the Inuvik Native Band Election Code.

"Council" means the Inuvik Native Band Council and is comprised of one Chief and 8 Councilors.

"Councilor" means a member of Council that is not the Chief.

"Council Member" means the Chief or a Councilor.

"DIANO" means the Department of Indian and Northern Affairs of the Federal Government.

"Election Committee" means the impartial committee appointed by the existing Council to select the electoral staff, supervise the election process and decide on election appeals (Sections 15 and 16, Sections 64 to 70).

"Election day" means the day set aside for the election of the Inuvik Native Band Council, in the year that the term of the previous Council comes to an end (Section 14) or, if an entire Council resigns or is removed from office pursuant to Sections 75 to 78, at a time determined by the majority of electors.

"Elector" (also known as voter) means a person qualified to vote in the Inuvik Native Band Council elections (Section 10).

"Electoral Assistant" means a person appointed to assist in the election pursuant to Section 47.

"Electoral Staff' means the Electoral Officer (Section 19) and Deputy Electoral Officer (Section 20).

"Employee" means a salaried person working for the Inuvik Native Band Council. "Existing Council" means the Inuvik Native Band Council in office prior to the election.

GNWT means Government of the Northwest Territories.

"Quorum"(The minimum number of Chief, Sub-Chief, and Councilors required to hold a meeting) Chief or Sub-Chief and four Councilors.)

"Quorum of Assemblies" minimum of 20 members

"Registered member" means a person whose name appears on the Indian Register and on the Inuvik Native Band's membership list as a member of the Inuvik Native Band.

"Spoiled ballots" The following are spoiled ballots and are not counted:

Any ballot that has any writing or marking except an X in the appropriate boxes.

- J> Any ballot with marks, markings not intended to be X's
- J> Any ballot with X's outside the appropriate boxes.
- J> Any ballot without the initial of at least two (2) members of the Election Committee.
- J> Any ballot found in the wrong ballot box
- J> Any ballot for Chief with more than one (1) X

Any ballot for Council with more than eight (8) X's

"Voting station" (also known as polling station) is a place set aside for voting in the community for resident electors to vote onelection day (Section 43).

"Voting compartment" (also known as a voting or polling *booth*) is a place set aside in the voting station where an elector may cast a ballot

2 . Application and coming into force	Upon ratification by the electors as per Sections 81 and 82, this election code shall apply to all subsequent elections and by-elections for the positions of Chief and Councilor in the <i>Inuvik Native Band</i> .
3. Composition of Council	<ol> <li>The Council of the <i>Inuvik Native Band</i> could consist of one Chief and 8 Councilors. One Councilor position shall be chosen by the Council, once elected, as Sub-Chief.</li> </ol>
4. Term of Office	4. The term of office for all positions in the <i>Inuvik Native Band</i> Council shall be <i>3 years</i> .
5. Vacancies on Council	<ul> <li>5. A vacancy shall be declared on Council when a Council member resigns his/her office;</li> <li>(1) is unable to continue his/her duties due to illness, disability or death;</li> <li>(2) becomes ineligible to hold office under Section 75; or</li> <li>(3) is removed from office under Sections 76 to 78.</li> </ul>
6. Vacancies on Council less than 6 months	6. If one or more vacancies occur less than six (6) months prior to the end of the Council's normal term of office it I they shall remain unfilled and the quorum of Council shall be reduced appropriately.
7. Procedures for filing vacancies longer than 6 months	<ul> <li>7. Vacancies <i>longer than six (6) months</i> shall be ordered filled by Council <i>either by</i></li> <li>(1) appointing to fill the remainder of the term by the candidate who received the next highest number of votes in the previous election as per Sections 62 and 63; or</li> </ul>

# 10.Eligibility of Electors

**10.** To be eligible as an elector a person must be:

- (1) Subject to (2), a <u>registered member</u> of the **Inuvik Native Band as listed on Status Indian Registry maintained by the DIANO unless** there is a Band Council Resolution stating that the person wishing to be an Elector, has been accepted by the Inuvik Native Band, in which case the person need not be a registered Member as listed in the Status Indian Registry of DIANO,
- (2) If a person wishing to become an elector of the Inuvik Native Band came from a section 10, Indian Act band, a Band Council Resolution from the section 10 Band acknowledging the transfer of Band Membership is also required before the person may be accepted as an elector:
- (3) 18 years of age or over on election day; and
- (4) a Canadian citizen.

# 11.Eligibility of candidates for the position of Councilor

- 11. To be eligible as a candidate for the position of Councilor, a person must:
- (1) be a registered member of the Inuvik NativeBand;
- (2) be 18 years of age or over on election day;
- (3) be a Canadian citizen;
- (4) be continuously resident in the community a minimum of six months prior to election day and ordinarily resident in the community;
- not be an employee of the Inuvik Native Band unless, upon nomination, the employee takes leave without pay from the employee's position with the band and resigns from that position with the Inuvik Native Band if elected.
- (6) not be a member of the Election Committee appointed by the existing Council under Section 15 nor a person serving as Electoral Officer or Deputy Electoral Officer under Section 17.
- (7) not be convicted of or serving a sentence for an indictable offense as of nomination day; and
- (8) not be in debt to the Inuvik Native Band, including amounts for which the person has guaranteed or co-signed on behalf of another, for an amount of \$500.00 or more on which the person has not made a payments in accordance with the terms of the agreement governing the debt for 90 days or more prior to nomination day.

To be eligible as a candidate for the position of Chief, a person must: 12. 12. 24.Eligibility to nominate candidates	24. Only electors as defined in Section 1O are eligible to nominate candidates for the positions of Chief and Councilor.
25.Limit on nominations	25. Each elector may nominate only one candidate for the position of Chief and one candidate for the position of Councilor but may second any number of nominations.
26.Procedures for nominations by non- resident electors	<ul> <li>Non-resident electors may nominate candidates through the following mail-in procedure: Two (2) copies of the Nomination Form (Appendix BJ) shall be sent, along with two (2) copies of the Elector's Declaration Form (Appendix DJ) and a stamped envelope addressed to the Inuvik Native Band Electoral Officer, to every non-resident elector whose last address is known no later than 75 days before election day. A non-resident elector who wishes to nominate one or two candidates pursuant to Section 25 will be required to</li> <li>fill out the Elector's Declaration Form (Appendix DJ) and Part 1 of the Nomination Form(s) (Appendix BJ; ensure that another qualified elector seconds the nomination(s) by filling out Part 2 of the Nomination Form(s) (Appendix BJ) and filling out his/her own Elector's Declaration Form (Appendix DJ); ensure that the candidate(s) consent(s) to the nomination by completing Part 3 of the Nomination Form (Appendix BJ); and ensure that all completed forms are mailed to the Electoral Officer (or faxed with the originals to follow) to be received on or before the close of nominations (Section 28).</li> </ul>

27.Procedures for nominations by resident electors	<ul> <li>27. (a) Resident electors may nominate candidates at any time following the posting of the List of Electors (Section 22) until the close of nominations (Section 28). Nominations must be in writing on a Nomination Form (Appendix B), obtainable from the Electoral Officer.</li> <li>(b) If the Inuvik Native Band wishes to conduct a Nomination_Meeting, the date of that meeting shall be no later than 67 days before election day. 28.Close of	28. The close of nominations shall be at 5:00 PM no later than 66 days before Election Day.
29.Publication of the List of Candidates	<ul> <li>29. Upon the close of nominations the Electoral Officer shall verify the validity of all nominations in accordance with this code and shall:</li> <li>(1) post a copy of List of Candidates, the date of the election, hours of voting (Section 44) and location of the voting station (Section 43) next to each posted List of Electors in the <i>community</i> as per Section 22; and</li> <li>(2) mail a copy of the above to each non-resident elector.</li> </ul>
30.Withdrawal of Candidates	30. Candidates wishing to withdraw from the election must submit a written statement to that effect to the Electoral Officer no later than 5 working days after the close of nominations.
31.Candidates declared elected by acclamation	31. In the event that only one qualified candidate is nominated for the position of Chief and/or no more than <b>seven</b> (1) qualified candidates are nominated for the Councilors' positions by the close of nominations no election will be held for that/those position(s) and the Electoral Officer shall declare that/those candidate(s) <b>ACCLAIMED</b> on the appropriate form(s) (Appendices J and I or K).
32. Method of voting	<ul> <li>32. 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<b>33.</b> The Electoral Officer shall prepare ballots for the position of Chief listing the last names of candidates in alphabetical order on a sheet of paper of a specific colour as shown in Appendix C(1).
<b>34.</b> The Electoral Officer shall prepare ballots for the Councilor positions listing the last names of candidates in alphabetical order on a sheet of paper as shown in <b>Appendix C(2)</b> .
35. If two or more candidates share the same name the Electoral Officer may add such additional information to the ballot as he/she deems necessary to distinguish between them.
<b>36.</b> If approved within the previous Council's election budget, the Electoral Officer may arrange for a photo of each candidate to appear beside his/her name.
<ul> <li>37. The Electoral Officer shall <ul> <li>prepare twenty percent (20%) more ballots for the positions of Chief and Councilors than the number of eligible residential and non-residential electors on the List of Electors (Section 21);</li> <li>count all the ballots so prepared; and</li> <li>store them in a safe place prior to use.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<b>38.</b> The Electoral Officer shall prepare, a sufficient number of Elector's Declaration Forms (Appendix D), to be used by all non-resident and resident electors who may wish to vote by mail-in ballot.

No later than 56 days before election day the Electoral Officer shall mail to every resident elector that advises the Electoral Officer that they will be absent on election day and to every non-resident elector a mail-in ballot kit consisting of: <ol> <li>a ballot for the position of Chief (Appendix C (1)) folded and signed on the outside by the Electoral Officer;</li> <li>a ballot for the positions of Councilor (Appendix C (2)) folded and signed on the outside by the Electoral Officer;</li> <li>an envelope large enough to hold the ballots marked BALLOT;</li> <li>an Elector's Declaration Form (Appendix DJ;</li> <li>a stamped envelope large enough to hold items as per 1 to 4 above addressed to the Inuvik Native Band Electoral Officer; and;</li> <li>a letter as shown in Appendix E inviting anyone who wishes to vote by mail to contact the Electoral Officer for the necessary forms.</li> </ol> </li> <li>The Electoral Officer</li> </ul>

No later than 55 days</b> before Election Day the Electoral Officer shall prepare a Voters' Register (Appendix F). Should any changes occur in the List of Electors pursuant to Section 23, the Electoral Officer shall make identical changes to the Voters' Register (Appendix F).
41. Procedure for receiving mailin ballots	<ul> <li>As each mail-in ballot is received, The Electoral Officer shall verify the information on the Elector's Declaration Form (Appendix D);</li> <li>indicate on the Voters' Register (Appendix F) that the elector's mail-in ballot has been received and cross off the elector's name; and</li> <li>store the unopened BALLOT envelope in a safe place until Election Day.</li> </ul>
42.Campaigning by Candidates	42. Candidates may campaign openly <i>in the community</i> and to reach non-resident electors <i>up to the day before Election Day.</i>
43. Provisions of a Voting Station	<ul> <li>The existing Council shall provide a place <i>in the community</i> for voting on election day ("voting station") which has</li> <li>easy access for all resident electors, including those who are handicapped;</li> <li>an entry door through which access can be controlled when the hours of voting are over; and</li> <li>access for electoral staff and assistants to washrooms.</li> </ul>
44.Hours of voting at voting station	The hours of voting at the voting station shall be from 9:00 AM to 7:00 PM on Election Day.
45. Duties of the Electoral Officer one day prior to Election Day	<ul> <li>On the day before election day the Electoral Officer shall Appoint and swear in, using the wording in Appendix G, any persons deemed to be necessary, to provide assistance to electors during the hours of voting including, but not limited to voting station clerks, interpreters and drivers ("Electoral Assistants"); prepare the final Voters' Register; and ensure that the following physical facilities, supplies and equipment for voting are in place in the voting station: <ul> <li>tables and chairs for all voting station clerks;</li> <li>chairs for assistants and candidates' representatives,</li> <li>ballots;</li> <li>ballot boxes;</li> <li>a copy of the Voters' Register (Appendix F) for each voting station clerk;</li> <li>tallying sheets;</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Prior to the opening of the voting station the Electoral Officer shall sign the oath / affirmation of all candidates' representatives present as per <i>Appendix I</i>;</li> <li>(2) ensure that any campaign material from any candidate is removed from the voting station;</li> <li>(3) open all ballot boxes to show to those who are present that they are empty;</li> <li>(4) close and seal allballot boxes;</li> <li>(5) retrieve and open each mail-in ballotreceived;</li> <li>(6) verify that the name of each elector who submitted a mail-in ballot has been crossed off the Voters' Register (<i>Appendix F</i>);</li> <li>(7) verify his/her signature on the outside of each folded ballot; and without unfolding the ballot, insert each into the ballot box.</li> </ul>
47.0pening the voting station	47. At the published opening time the Electoral Officer shall open the door of the voting station to allow voting to begin.
48.Procedure for obtaining a ballot	<ul> <li>48. As each elector reaches a voting clerk's table, the voting clerk shall cross off the elector's name on the Voters' Register (Appendix F) as having received a Chief's and a Councilors' ballot;</li> <li>(2) fold the ballots so that the candidates' names are on the inside;</li> <li>(3) initial each ballot on the outside and hand it to the elector;</li> <li>(4) provide the elector with an interpreter if necessary; and direct the elector to a voting compartment.</li> </ul>
49.Procedure for marking a ballot	<ul> <li>49. Upon reaching the voting compartment, the elector shall place a mark (☒} in the box opposite the candidate (for Chief) and candidates (for Councilor) of his/her choice which does not identify him/her as the voter;</li> <li>(2) fold the ballots in the same way they were received; and return them folded to the voting clerk from whom they were received.</li> </ul>

50.Procedure for returning a ballot	<ul> <li>Upon receiving the folded ballots, the voting clerk shall verify his/her initials on the outside of the ballot; mark the ballot as returned on the Voters' Register (Appendix F); and</li> <li>place the folded ballot into the ballot box.</li> </ul>
51.Elector unable to mark ballots	<b>51.</b> If an elector is unable to mark the ballots, he/she received due to an impairment, the Electoral Officer may authorize a person to assist the elector and shall instruct the voting clerk to note that fact in the Voters' Register (Appendix F).
52.Elector marks ballot by mistake	<ul> <li>52. If an elector marks a ballot by mistake, he/she may return the ballot to the voting clerk who shall</li> <li>(1) mark the ballot as CANCELLED and place it in a separate envelope;</li> <li>(2) indicate the receipt and cancellation of the ballot on the Voters' Register (Appendix F); and</li> <li>(3) provide the elector with a second ballot.</li> </ul>
53.Closing the voting station	<ul> <li>At the published closing time the Electoral Officer shall close the door of the voting station; and</li> <li>(2) allow only those electors to vote who are already inside the voting station.</li> </ul>
54.Procedure following voting	<ul> <li>After all remaining electors have voted and left the voting station the Electoral Officer shall</li> <li>invite any candidates' representatives present to witness the ballot count;</li> <li>verify that the seals on the ballot boxes are intact;</li> <li>direct the ballot boxes tobe opened;</li> <li>supervise the counting and tallying of each ballot for the position of Chief; and</li> <li>supervise the counting and tallying of each ballot for the Councilors' positions.</li> </ul>

Examination and recording of ballots for Chief	<ul> <li>As each ballot for Chief is opened the voting clerk shall ensure that all those witnessing the counting of ballots can clearly see how it is marked and</li> <li>(1) record the vote on a tallying sheet beside each candidate's name; place each valid ballot in a separate pile for each candidate; and if a ballot is spoiled, place it in a separate pile for spoiled Chiefs ballots.</li> </ul>

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56. Examination and recording ballots for Councilors	<ul> <li>56. As each ballot for Councilors is opened the voting clerk shall ensure that all those witnessing the counting of ballots can clearly see how it is marked and</li> <li>(1) record the votes for all candidates, if 7 or more, on a tallying sheet beside the candidates' names;</li> <li>(2) place all valid ballots in one pile; and</li> <li>(3) place all spoiled ballots for Councilors in a separate pile.</li> </ul>
57.Tie votes for position of Chief	<ul> <li>57. Should the highest number of ballots cast for two or more candidates for Chief be equal, the Electoral Officer shall conduct a recount;</li> <li>(2) if all satisfied with recount and still tie vote the Electoral Officer shall call for a by election;</li> <li>(3) the Electoral officer will set a date for the by-election within two weeks;</li> </ul>
58. Tie votes for position of Councilor	<ul> <li>58. Should one or more candidates for the position of Councilor receive the same number of ballots as the candidate with the ih lowest number of ballots, the Electoral Officer shall</li> <li>(1) conduct a recount;</li> <li>(2) if all satisfied with recount and still tie vote the Electoral Officer shall call for aby-election;</li> <li>(3) the Electoral officer will set a date for the by-election to be conducted within two weeks of the original election day where there is no appeal of the results or within 21 days after the Elections Committee denies any appeal in respect of the election which bears upon the need for a by-election;</li> </ul>
59. Record of votes for Chief's position	<b>59.</b> After all the ballots for the Chief's position have been counted, the Electoral Officer shall direct that the votes be recorded and the elected candidate declared as shown in <b>Appendix J</b> .
60. Record of votes for Councilors' position	60. After all the ballots for the Councilors' positions have been counted, the Electoral Officer shall direct that the votes be recorded and the elected candidates declared as shown in Appendix K.
61. Entitlement to administrative recount	61. Any candidate whose margin of loss is one (1) vote or one percent (1%) of the total number of votes cast (whichever is greater) shall be entitled to an administrative recount which shall, if requested by the candidate, be carried out by the Electoral Officer immediately after the recording of the votes.

## **Appendix H**

#### **ELECTORAL OFFENCES**

Under the *Inuvik Native Band* Election Code it is an offence for an elector, candidate, candidate's representative or electoral assistant to

- 1. influence or attempt to influence an elector to vote or not vote for some candidate(s) by means of libel, bribery, threats, force or intimidation;
- 2. Intentionally direct an elector with an impairment to vote for any candidate other than the one(s) he/she chooses;
- **3.** impersonate another elector in order to vote;
- **4.** vote twice or attempt to vote twice except as provided for in the code (i.e., receive a second ballot to replace onethat has been cancelled);
- **5.** campaign in any way in or near the Voting Station on Election Day on behalf of a candidate;
- **6.** use or attempt to use any form of ballot other than the one issued by the Electoral Officer or Voting Clerk;
- 7. intentionally remove ballots from the Voting Station;
- **8.** intentionally disrupt the orderly conduct of the electoral process inside the Voting Station; or
- **9.** assist another person to commit an election offence.
- 10. to harass or hinder the electoral officers

Under the *Inuvik Native Band* Election Code it is also an offence for the Electoral Officer, Deputy Electoral Officer or Voting Clerk to

- 1. knowingly unfold and examine any returned ballot prior to depositing it in the ballot box;
- 2. divulge information to anyone as to how an elector voted;
- 3. neglect, fail or refuse to carry out his/her duties under this code.

<u>Note:</u> A perceived offence under this code is grounds for appealing the validity of the election of any candidate to the Election Committee as provided for in the code.
